Currently SAVE reaches out to children, young women, women, and textile and garment workers including the migrant workers. Since 1995, SAVE has been carrying out programs among children in distress primarily among the children working in textile and hazardous industries with specific emphasis on promotion of health and educational rights through special schooling for the drop out children and child labourers and through vocational training support. Community sensitization is one of the main activities towards prevention of child labour. SAVE initiated campaigns and advocacy strategies could mainstream the issues of child labour and the plight of young girls in the garment and textile industry. SAVE has the unique credibility of being the champion organization in exposing the child labour issues in Tirupur.

Workshop on Gender Violence Free Workplace and Living Wage

The workshop on Gender Violence free workplace and living wage was illustrious and it was held in KSR Mahal, Tirupur on 7th February 2019. The workshop was organized by SAVE and it was headed by the Mr. A. Aloysius, Managing Director-SAVE and Ms. A. Viyakula Mary, the Executive Director-SAVE.





Women's conference at KSR Mandapam 07.02.2019

Mr. A. Aloysius explained about the essential and non-essential expenses. He termed the essential expenses as food, shelter and clothing and the non-essential things as expenditure for celebrations, functions and other events. He expressed his views on the workers remuneration and the



benefits of the labourers. The statistics

about the population was discussed and it was said that among twenty-five lakh people, women workers were estimated as 4 lakh people. He said that if a monthly wage of 18000 to 20000 is given only, an individual can run a family without any debt. He ended up his interaction with a

Ms. Viyakula Mary portrayed the picture of how equality is discriminated from the birth of a kid. A girl child is brought up in a manner that "she should stay at home, do makeups for her beauty, play with cookware items. But a boy child is brought up in a manner that "He could go out for



playing, can do mechanic works and so on. The ultimate theme was that" Gender discrimination starts from there and it should be changed in the forth coming years and men and women should be treated equally from the birth and they must be given equal respect. So that they would be able to face the challenges at the workplace and would be able to learn the techniques against sexual harassment and workplace harassment. She concluded her presentation by her words that "Men and women should be given rights in an equal manner". Finally, the valedictory thoughts were shared by Ms. Viyakula Mary. She thanked the entire fraternity for the constant support that they rendered throughout the workshop. She thanked the Staffs of SAVE for having organized such a beneficial workshop.

language barriers. SAVE Staffs

identified them and gave a new life by enrolling them in the Sevanthampalayam ALC. Now they are enjoying their livelihood in a studious manner.

Durga Kumari aged 11 left the school in 4th std. Being a Migrant child, she was unable to pursue her studies. SAVE staffs identified her and enrolled in Paapanayakkanpalayam ALC. Now she is able to learn her subjects in 3 languages.

She was forced to discontinue her studies after Class V when her family fell on hard times. Being a dropout, she came to Tirupur along with her family for the sake of livelihood. At that juncture, her father passed away, which was again a heart break for her. Family situation and poverty made her to go for Garments and she earned Thirty Rupees per day. She continued her work for few days. After which SAVE staff Vasanthi identified and rescued her and made her to join in Pandian Nagar Alternative Learning Centre. She belongs to a nuclear family, where her Mother Gowri and Brother Suresh lives along with her. She studied her VI and VII Standard in SAVE Centre for 2 years, after which she was mainstreamed in Pandian Nagar High School. She had completed her Bachelor of Business Administration. Now with all her efforts, she had joined as an Accountant.

 Indian Express 02.02.2019; Interim Budget fails to impress Tirupur industrialists – Announced pension scheme a mere eyewash – TN farmers association wants loan waiver scheme – budget belies hopes of farmers...

Tirupur businessmen were disappointed with the 2019-20 interim budget presented on Friday as it had nothing to do to the industrial sector.

The announcement of a pension scheme for unorganized labour in the budget was just "old wine in a new bottle' charged United Federation Trade Unions State President EVK Shanmugam.

Tamilnadu small and marginal farmers association was disappointed over the budget not including a loan waiver scheme.

The interim budget belied the hopes of farmers this year as well in terms of doubling farmers' income charged Tamilnadu Agriculturalists Federation State President and lawyer C Nallasamy.

It illustrates that the crime against women are increasing day by day; it is noticed in 2014 as 89,423; in 2015 as 94,172 and in 2016 as 1,06,958.

The amendment of the law bought by the Central Government for preventing children from sexual harassment states the following;

- If children within 12 years of age are raped, minimum of 29 years sentence of jail or maximum of death penalty
- Similarly, if children between 12 to 16 years of age are raped, minimum of 29 years sentence of jail or maximum of death penalty
- 10-year imprisonment to those involve in sexual harassment against women
- No anticipatory bail for those involves in sexual harassment against girls within 16 years of age
- The investigation of the case within 2 months' time and the petition for appeal within 6 months' time has to be completed
- The government and the victim's representative should be consulted before the accused can be granted bail
